 - Level 5 Diploma in Teaching in the Lifelong Learning Sector [DTLLS].
 - Certificate in Education or Postgraduate Certificate in Education.
- Be occupationally competent in the area of PE and school sport - e.g...
 - Being a practising PE specialist and being able to demonstrate current knowledge and understanding of school sport policy.
- Hold or be working towards an assessor qualification - e.g...
 - Level 3 Award in Assessing Vocationally Related Achievement.
 - Level 3 Award in Assessing Competence in the Work Environment.
 - Level 3 Certificate in Assessing Vocational Achievement;
 - ENTO Unit D32/33 or the A1/A2 Assessor Units.
 - 1st4sport Introduction to Assessment Practice in Sport (IAPS) qualification.
- Hold a Level 2 qualification relevant to course content.

All members of the training team will need:

- Have an understanding of Premier's products and their impact on children and young adults.
- Work to and aim to achieve Premier's core values.
- Adhere to and use as best practise Premier's policies and procedures.
